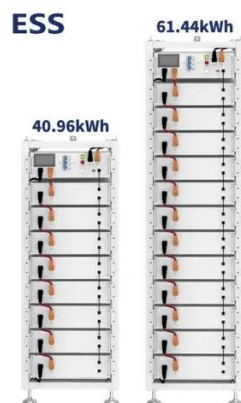
As of 31 December 2024, we had 3,101 base stations (1,695 own built & 1,406 collocated). We have now covered all the 26 large and medium cities listed in the license.

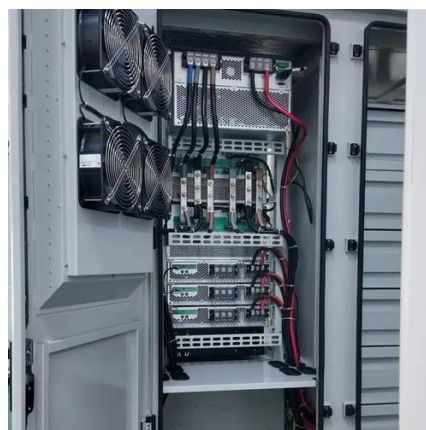
