Overview

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) is a primary regulator of solar company sales and marketing practices. The FTC investigates complaints about misleading advertising, predatory contracts, high-pressure sales tactics, and misrepresentations about the costs and benefits of solar. At the same time, federal and state regulators have received an increase in consumer complaints about a small number of unscrupulous solar companies. Some people have complained that they were deceived about costs and savings, misled about loans and tax credits, and pressured by aggressive sales. 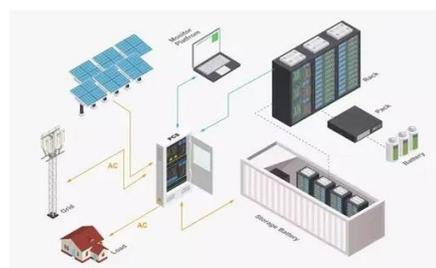

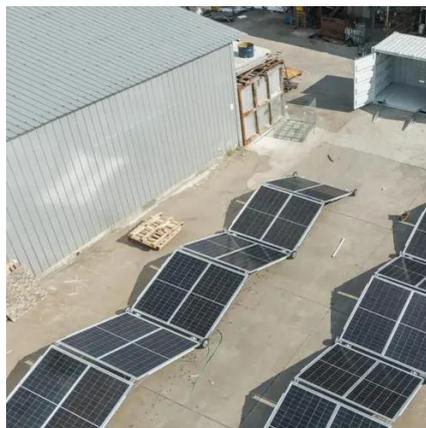
